Class 2 Update

We would also like to congratulate all the previous class I group that have decided to continue on to the new challenges of class 2. Remember to stick with it and practice, practice, practice!

Your instructor for this round is Sam Clifford.

We are in the process of editing the class 2 manual, making sure the exercise line up with what is in our instruc-

tors manual and making sure also that we are not repeating ourselves. It is our aim to try and make your training experiences as rewarding as possible, as well as more enjoyable for you and your dog. Sometimes the exercises may seem a little repetitive, but rest assure, what may seem repetitive may be an exercise that is being extended and built upon from what you have

learned in class I. We are also adding some more tricks and games for you and your dog to learn.



Class 3 & 4 Update

Class 3 and 4 will remain combined at the moment as we seem to be down on instructor again.

Occasionally, group 4 may break off to do some more advanced maneuvers or training for RallyO trials (instructors permitting).

By the time you have reached

this level, we hope that you and your dog are becoming a great team. At this level we also expect that your dog is responding reasonably quickly to your commands. If not...remember to stick with it and practice, practice! The more time you put

into your dog, the better the outcome. Just remember that training sessions don't need to be a set formal time. Taking a few minutes during an add break or a few minutes before you put their food bowl down on the ground may be all they need each day.

What's the difference???

In class I we try to give a description of the different types of collars that are used in training. Below we have given some examples of the variety that is available. The choice is very individual and is often based on your dogs requirements (eg. Do they pull).

Flat Collar



These come in all sorts of shapes and sizes and can be made from leather or fabric.



Check Chain

Used correctly, these can be a useful tool in training your dog. When used incorrectly they become the frowned upon choker chain. Please ask your instructor how to fit yours correctly.



Martingale

A martingale combines the flat collar and the check chain, without the choking potential that the check chain can have associated with it, if used incorrectly.

We do not recommend a back clip harness as they only encourage the dog to pull.



Front Connect Harness

Halti - for dogs that love to pull!

A Halti works by gently steering the head and therefore controlling the dog's direction of movement, making training easy and putting you, the owner, back in control.
